Together, we are inviting you to join us on Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> April to support this keynote national day of commemoration. We are also asking your union to mark the day by considering a range of suggested initiatives that you might implement, listed overleaf.

Congress President Kevin Callinan will be joined by Sharon McGuinness, CEO of the Health & Safety Authority, and Minister Damien English TD who will lay a wreath on behalf of the state to remember those workers we have lost.

In Ireland in the ten year period between 2012 and 2021, 481 people were killed in work-related incidents and many thousands more were severely injured or made ill. You will all know that in addition to these official figures, we have lost many more front-line workers to Covid-19 over the last 2 years. In 2021, 38 people were killed in accidents,. These are unacceptable figures which can be reduced through a combined and intensified effort by all concerned. By working together and promoting the practice of safety and health in workplaces throughout Ireland we will achieve a significant drop in these dreadful numbers. We all have a responsibility to make sure that happens.
